#### NAME CHANGE

## YOUTH AND PHILANTHROPY INITIATIVE (YPI)

In 2008 the Wood Foundation introduced an initiative that was to be delivered in Scottish education. Over the years YPI has engaged more than 350,000 young people who have taken responsibility for £7.6m of charitable giving.

Each school is responsible for directing a grant of £3,000 to a local charity championed by its students through a unique programme of teamwork, research and competition.

This year we have been visited by 3 separate groups of pupils all from Monifieth High school. Each group has visited the Society and engaged with our members, finding out about the services we offer and how it benefits everyone, and joined in with some of the activities. Group one joined in with the seated dancing, group two got very competitive with the games and the third group explored their musical talents with the fun drum.

It is fair to say that it has been a wonderful experience for both pupils and members. For the pupils they have found out about the various eye conditions our members have and the impact it has on their daily lives, and for our members it has been a delight to see them taking time to share their individual experiences.

The next step is for each group of pupils to prepare a presentation for a panel of independent evaluators who will then decide who wins the competition. The winning group receives prize money which is given to their chosen charity.

This year we have had 3 fully engaged and keen groups of pupils who have even borrowed some of our simulation glasses to use as part of their presentations.

We are keeping our fingers crossed that we are selected to receive some of the money as that

would be a wonderful outcome, especially as each group have been a delight to have in the Society.
